



MSc in Finance Employment Report 2025



This MSc Employment Report is released on June 2025 by the Academic Steering Committee of the MSc in Finance, University of Siena. The results of this report provide information about the first year jobs of our 2023 graduates. The report is based on data from the survey conducted during the year 2024 by the Italian inter-university consortium *AlmaLaurea*.¹

As a comparison group, all MSc in Finance graduates of 18 Italian universities² of the *AlmaLaurea* consortium, were considered.

MSc graduate profile

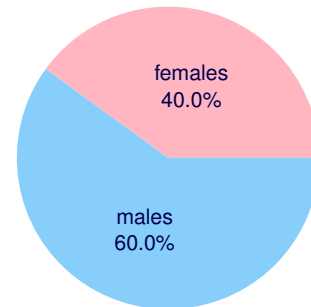
The panel is composed by the 15 graduates in year 2023 responding to the survey.

The total number of graduates in that year was 24 (response rate 62.5%).

The average age at graduation was 27.7.

The average study duration was 3.8 years.

Of the 15 graduates responding to the survey, 6 were female and 9 were male.



Comparison group

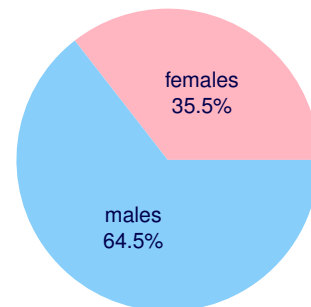
The comparison group lists 577 graduates in year 2023 responding to the survey.

The total number of graduates in that year was 842 (response rate 68.5%).

The average age at graduation was 25.8 (min 24.1 max 27.7 across universities).

The average study duration was 2.7 years (min 1.9, max 3.8 across universities).

Of the 577 graduates responding to the survey, 205 were female and 372 were male.



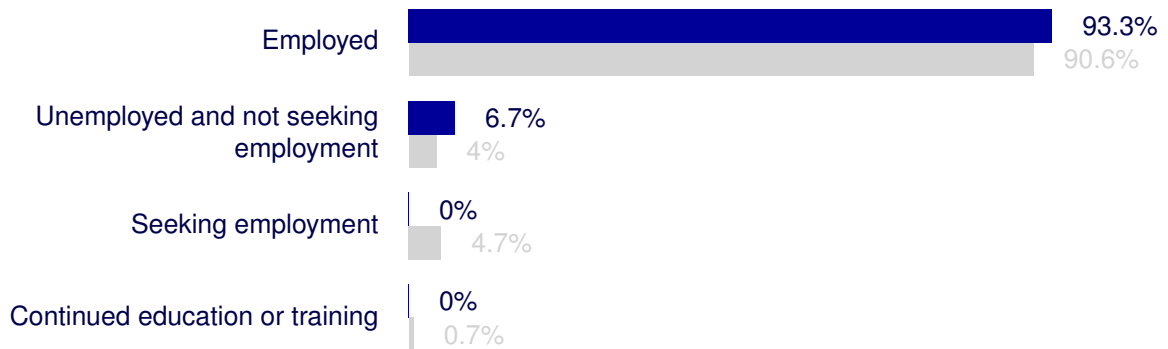

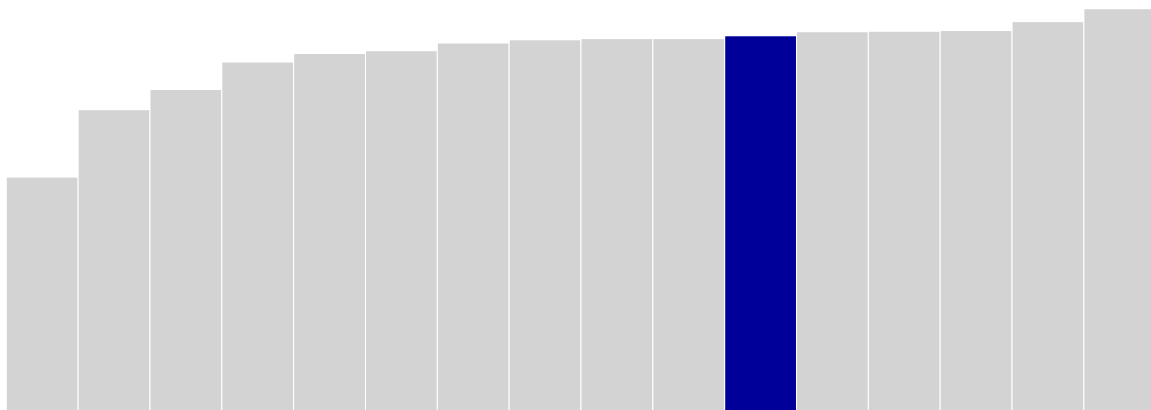
Employment

How many MSc graduates are employed?

Of the 15 graduates in 2023 responding to the survey, 93.3% was employed in 2024; the total employment rate (Eurostat definition) was 93.3% (83.3% for females, 100% for males). In the comparison group, 90.6% was employed; the total employment rate (Eurostat definition) was 90.6% (90.5% for females, 90.7% for males). A breakdown of the global employment situation is drawn in the following barchart (Siena MSc in Finance graduates in blue, comparison group in gray).



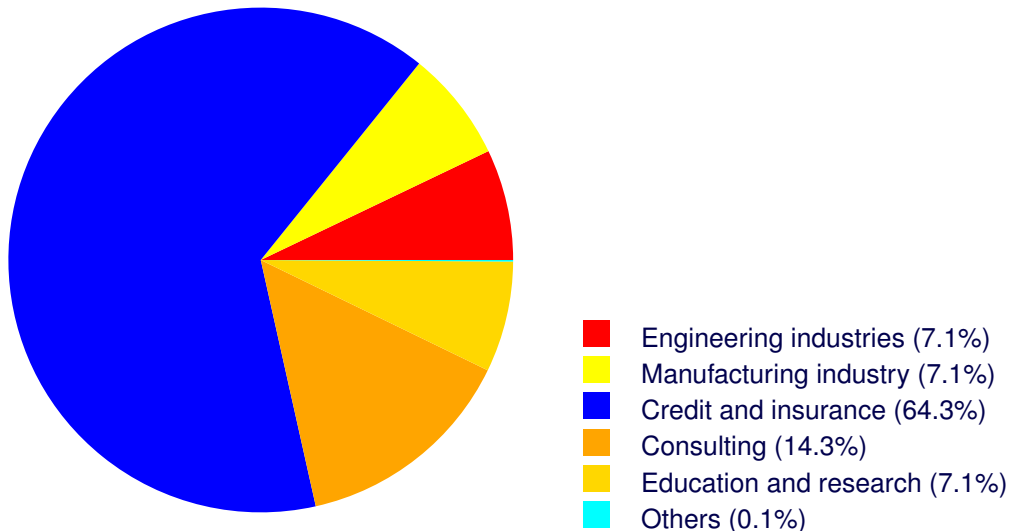
The next barchart shows the ranking of the employment rate (ratio between employed and respondents) of our graduates (blue) within the comparison group.³



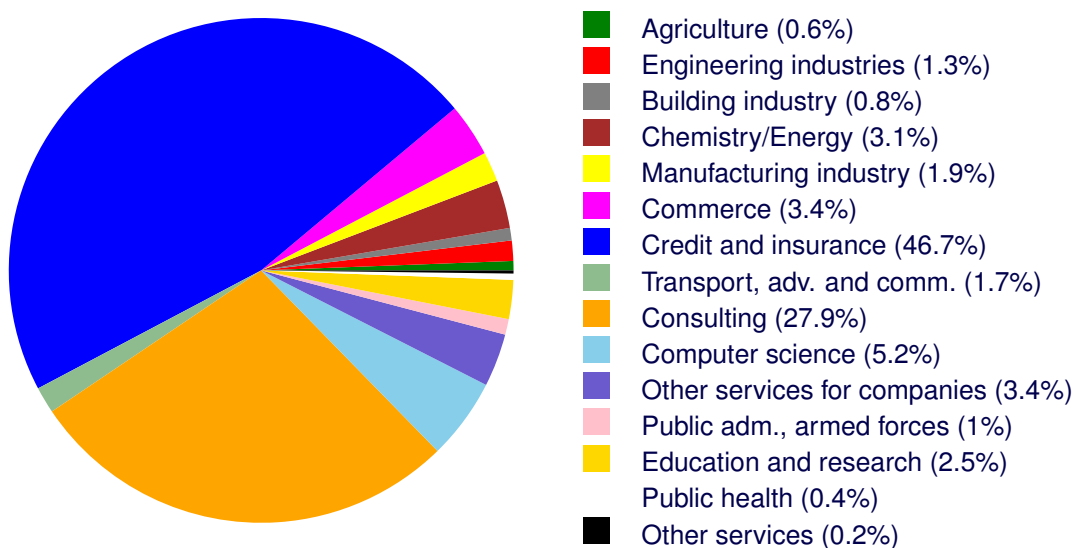

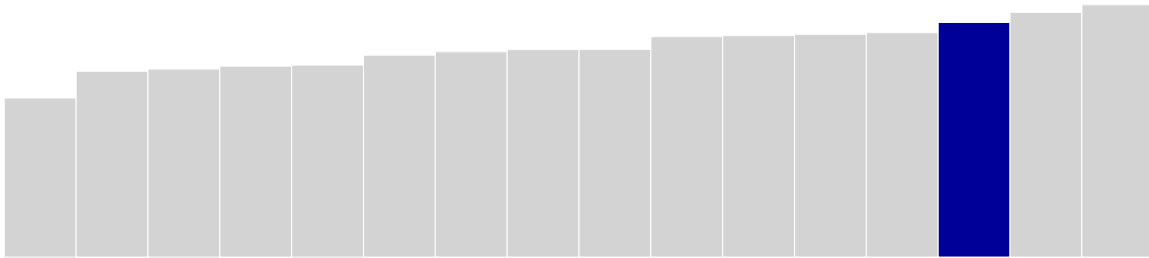
Salary and contract

Salary

The average net salary in 2024 of the employed graduates was 1,976 € per month (1,782 € males average, 2,326 € females average).

The comparison group reported an average of 1,779 € per month (min 1,340 €, max 2,125 € across universities).

The barchart shows the ranking of the average salary level of our graduates (blue) within the comparison group.⁴



Contract type

The next barchart shows the distribution of employment contract type between the 14 employed graduates (Siena MSc in Finance graduates in blue, comparison group in gray).

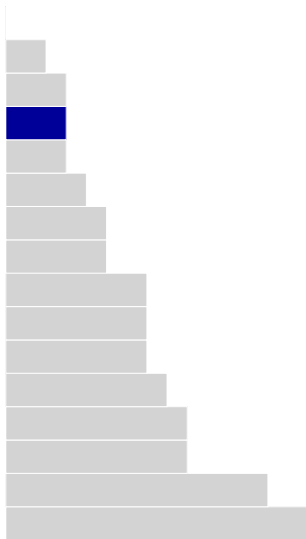
Finding a job

Graduates start their job search after 0.3 months on average and find it after 4.6 months on average. The time gap from graduation to first employment is therefore 4.9 months on average.

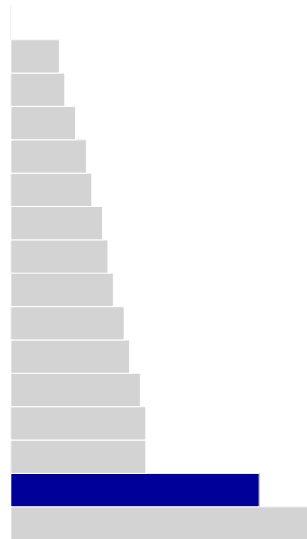
In the comparison group, the corresponding timings are: 0.6, 2, and 2.6 months, respectively.

The following barcharts rank timings of our graduates (in blue) within the comparison group.⁵

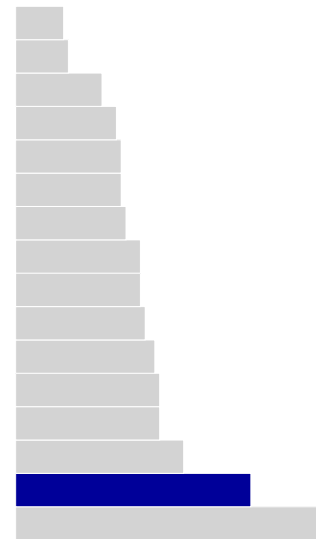
graduation → start search
